


Work starting soon on Caringbah upgrade

Roads and Maritime Services | December 2018

The NSW Government is delivering this project as part of its program to ease congestion and improve travel times on Sydney's key corridors.

Work will start early next year to reduce congestion and improve pedestrian safety at the intersection of Taren Point Road, The Boulevarde and Captain Cook Drive in Caringbah.



About the project

Work is planned to start on **1 February 2019**, weather permitting. Initial work will include establishing a site compound within Endeavour Sports High School. This will be followed by the relocation of water, gas and electricity services to allow for the road widening. The project will require the removal and trimming of some trees along the intersection.

Intersection upgrade

Work to upgrade the intersection will include:

- Widening Taren Point Road at the north-west corner of the intersection to include an additional right turn lane into The Boulevarde
- Relocating and widening the existing pedestrian crossing and kerb ramps on The Boulevarde, and changing the placement of the pedestrian crossing lights
- Replacing the existing foot path and fencing along the north-west corner of the intersection
- Resurfacing the road and adjusting line markings.

Student safety

The safety of students attending nearby Endeavour Sports and Caringbah high schools is our most important consideration. Traffic controllers will be on site when required, to help ensure students and other pedestrians can cross the road safely. Alternative pedestrian crossings will be in place while we work on existing crossings.

We'll be working closely with the schools to keep students, parents and teachers up-to-date with progress.

How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing noisier tasks by **midnight**.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane and road closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions. For the latest traffic updates, you can call **132 701**, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.

Our work schedule

We will be on site up to six days a week for 120 shifts on weekdays between 7am and 6pm, and between 8am and 1pm on Saturdays.

We will also work up to five nights a week for 180 shifts, between 8pm and 5am from Sunday to Thursday.

We will not work on public holidays.
