

Project update – Intersection improvements, Georges River Road, Croydon Park

The NSW Government is funding this proposal as part of its program to ease congestion, reduce traffic delays and improve travel times on Sydney’s major roads.



Roads and Maritime Services invited feedback in July 2018 on the proposed improvements to the intersection of Georges River Road, Portland Street and Lees Avenue in Croydon Park.

We received feedback from the community and stakeholders with a majority supporting the proposal.

Key issues raised during consultation has been summarised and our responses included in a community consultation report, which is available at rms.nsw.gov.au/projects/sydney-south/georges-river-rd-portland-st-lees-ave-croydon-park.

Changes to the proposal

After considering all responses, along with the proposal's aims and design requirements, we have decided to remove the left turn on red movements at the intersection and increase pedestrian protection with a red on left arrow.

What happens next?

Roads and Maritime will be carrying out investigation work on Georges River Road, Portland Street and Lees Avenue, Croydon Park. This will require potholing for utility location near the corner of Lees Avenue and Georges River Road to help develop a design for proposed intersection improvements.

Our work schedule

We will be on site between **Tuesday 18 September** and **Tuesday 18 December, 2018**, weather permitting. Our night work hours will be from **8pm** to **5am** from **Sunday** to **Friday**.

How will the work affect you?

Our work will be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact including completing the noisier tasks by **midnight**. We will also organise our schedule to ensure that we will not be working in each location for more than two consecutive nights or for more than six nights in a month.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times.
