



# Great Western Highway and Reservoir Road intersection upgrade, Blacktown

The NSW Government is investing in easing congestion, reducing travel times and improving safety at the Great Western Highway and Reservoir Road intersection in Blacktown.



Roads and Maritime Services is delivering improvements for all road users who travel through the Great Western Highway and Reservoir Road intersection in Blacktown.

The upgrade is expected to be completed in early 2020 and will include widening Reservoir Road to:

- extend the left turn on Reservoir Road easing congestion towards Blacktown
- create a second dedicated right turn lane improving traffic flow onto the Highway
- add a second dedicated right turn lane on the Highway reducing travel times towards Blacktown.

## Our work schedule

We will be on site for up to five days and five nights a week for 45 night and 51 day shifts between Saturday 17 August and Tuesday 15 October 2019, weather permitting, excluding public holidays.

Our day work hours will be between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Friday** and between **8am** to **1pm** on **Saturday**.

Our night work hours will be between **8pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Thursday**.

## What have we done?

#### We have:

- modified storm water drainage
- · removed the existing concrete median strip
- earthworks in the southwestern corner.

## Next stage

Activities included in this next stage are adjusting utilities, creating borders for the road surface, pouring concrete and earthworks. It will be necessary to carry out some of this work at night.

We will continue to update you on this project as work progresses, including informing you in advance about future work schedules and night work.

# How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing the noisier activities such as concrete cutting and jack hammering by **midnight**.

# Traffic changes

There may be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times.
