

Pacific Highway Upgrade

Turramurra to Wahroonga

Community Update - October 2022

The NSW Government is funding improvements at intersections on the Pacific Highway at Redleaf Avenue, Coonanbarra Road and Fox Valley Road to ease congestion and improve traffic flow.

What's happened?

From July to end of September 2022, we have:

- opened the footpath between Myall Avenue and Gilda Avenue
- been constructing new traffic signals at Redleaf Avenue
- installation of new stormwater drains
- commenced pavement construction
- · completing utilities relations
- private property work.

What's happening next?

Our work from October to December 2022 will include:

- finishing traffic signal upgrades and commissioning the new traffic lights at Redleaf Avenue
- commencement of asphalting and line marking
- commencement of concrete footpaths
- finalising private property work
- landscaping work on verges
- installing road furniture.

Our work schedules

Our day work hours remain from 7am to 6pm, Mondays to Fridays and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays. Our night work hours are from 8pm to 5am (the following day), between Sundays and Thursdays.

There are no day shifts on Sundays, public holidays or during heavy rainfall.

From Saturday 1 October to Friday 23 December, we will work up to six day shifts and five night shifts a week, weather and site conditions permitting.

How will the work affect you?

There may be noise and disruptions associated with our work and we will minimise impacts by applying mitigation measures such as aiming to complete high noise activities such as jackhammering and concrete saw cutting before **midnight.**

We will update you as work progresses and notify you prior to any changes to our work schedule.

We thank you for your patience while we carry out this important work.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary lane closures and detours in place for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists while we are working to ensure the work area is safe for road users and our workers.

There may also be partial footpath closures near our work areas for everyone's safety.

Clearly marked pedestrian detours will be provided.

Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controller directions.

Change in traffic conditions at Marshall Avenue

The permanent no right-turn from Marshall Avenue into Pacific Highway (southbound) will be introduced from **Wednesday 28 September** to allow the safe construction of the median and asphalting on the Pacific Highway for workers and motorists.

Access to Marshall Avenue will be left in left out only, and will remain in place once the project has been completed. The nearest and safest right turn intersections are located at Fox Valley Road and Kissing Point Road.

The no-right turn was detailed in the Review of Environmental Factors, approved in 2019.
