

New Intercity Fleet Gosford Stabling Yard

SEPTEMBER 2018 COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

The NSW Government is delivering a New Intercity Fleet to replace the trains carrying customers from Sydney to the Central Coast, Newcastle, the Blue Mountains and the South Coast.

The new state-of-the-art trains will replace the ageing V-Sets to provide customers with a more comfortable and reliable journey. The trains will feature wider, more spacious two by two seating for extra room and comfort with arm rests, tray tables and high seat backs, charging ports for mobile devices, dedicated spaces for luggage, prams and bicycles, improved accessibility including wheelchair access and accessible toilets, improved customer information through digital information screens and announcements, CCTV and help points, and modern heating, ventilation and air conditioning.

Modifications are required to accommodate the new trains at the existing stabling facility at Gosford.

Upcoming work in September

Activities will include the excavation and construction of new footings, footpaths and electrical routes and the installation of lighting and cabling to new light poles. The demobilising and clean-up of site will also commence in September.

All work will be carried out within the rail corridor. Workers will access the site area via Dane Drive, Donnison Street and the Pacific Highway. A map of the work area is provided overleaf.

Standard construction hours are 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8pm to 1pm Saturday.

Some work may be required outside of these hours however the local community will be notified prior to work taking place.

What you may notice

Equipment to be used includes excavators, vacuum trucks, crane trucks, concrete trucks and concrete pumps, tip trucks, flatbed trucks, construction vehicles and various hand and power tools.

All effort will be made to reduce potential impacts to businesses and residents, however there may be some noise and vibration associated with this work.

Temporary closure of parking spaces – Brian McGowan Bridge car park

Up to 12 parking spaces will be closed in the Brian McGowan Bridge car park until Tuesday 30 October 2018 to allow work to be carried out safely.
